History of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA)

- Signed into law by President Obama on March 23, 2010
 - Passed the U.S. Senate on December 24, 2009, passed by reconciliation (needed only 51 votes)
 - Passed the U.S. House of Representatives on March 21, 2010



President Obama

- Continue to champion implementation of the Affordable Care Act
 - Emphasizing the consumer protection aspects of the law
 - Eliminates denial of coverage due to pre-existing condition
 - No lifetime cap on coverage
 - Essential Health Benefits
 - Premium Assistance Tax Credits



Governor Romney

- Will issue an Executive Order that provides waivers to all fifty states in implementing the Affordable Care Act.
- Work with Congress to repeal the legislation as quickly as possible.



Governor Romney's Plan

- Return to states the responsibility of caring for the poor, uninsured, and chronically ill.
- Block grant Medicaid and other payments to states.
- Create purchasing pools for individuals and small businesses.
- Prevent discrimination against individuals with preexisting conditions
- Allow HSA's to be used for insurance premiums



Senate Control

- In order for President Obama to move forward with implementing the ACA or a Romney Administration to repeal/replace the ACA, they will need the support of the U.S. Senate.
 - 33 Senate Races
 - 10 Open Seats
 - 23 Incumbents
 - 6 "Toss-Up" Contests

 Likely scenario, no one party will hold "Super Majority" and the Chamber could be evenly split, 50/50.



House Control

- It is unlikely the Republicans will lose control of the House of Representatives, but Democrats are expected to pick up 7+ seats
- 435 Seats
 - 15 "Toss-Up" Contests
 - 4 Current D seats
 - 11 Current R seats
- Projected election outcome:
 - Republicans (235) & Democrats (200)
